



Parking & Entrance

EVENT INFORMATION

<u>Arrival</u>: It is important that all teams arrive on time and report to the check-in table immediately upon arrival. This will allow us to make the match schedule quickly. Please call 862-432-1526 if you are going to be late.

<u>Check In</u>: Team Check-In opens at 8:00 am. We ask our teams to arrive as close to 8:00 am as possible. We must process >24 teams through Robot Inspection (Hardware) and Field Inspection (Software/Android Pairing) before Matches can start.

<u>Meet & Pit Areas:</u> The fields will be located in the school's large downstairs Auditorium again this year. (The school's new Gymnasium construction is not yet complete.) Seating will be set up around the Fields. Pit Areas will be located within classrooms, adjacent to the Auditorium.

<u>Pit Area</u>: Please stay within the boundaries of your pit and be kind to your neighbors. If you have large banners, displays, or posters, we may find a space somewhere else in the Auditorium for these items. The Pit Areas should stay clear of obstructions to traffic and NO Team networks are allowed in the Pit.

Queuing: Per usual, Event Team Queuers will remind teams (as needed) to come to the Competition Area in time for matches. However, remember that Queuers are there to assist and the BEST teams queue themselves and don't need to be reminded that their match is coming up.

<u>Top Teams</u> are watching the Matches, then are in the Queuing area and ready to go for their Match. Please assign someone on your team to help to help your team perform like a top team!

<u>Supplies:</u> Be sure to bring a Utility Strip. Safety Glasses, Battery Chargers (marked with Team Number) and spare parts.

Opening Ceremony: We will make some remarks at the start of the first Match but there are no formal Ceremonies, per se, at a Meet.

<u>Match Lists:</u> We are often asked "when will Match Lists be available?". They will be handed out ~9:45. The information will be available sooner if all teams are able to pass inspection earlier., and help them as needed.

EVENT INFORMATION (continued)

<u>Inspection</u>: Arriving robots report IMMEDIATELY to Inspection. This is always the pacing element in starting the competition on time. Please help.

<u>Power Switch:</u> Remember that this year, it is not legal to have only the rocker switch on the Modern Robotics Core Power Module control your robot power. Teams MUST have a more easily accessible wired Power Switch on their robots, where FTA's can quickly access it if trouble develops.

Robot Marking: Remember to have your team numbers on the robot in large size, per spec. That sometimes does not happen early in the season. So too, make sure that your robot accommodates the mounting of the Alliance Flag.

Judging: There is no Judging at Meets.

<u>Food:</u> Our host will have breakfast / snack and lunch tables for our guests. Pizza orders will be taken immediately after Check-In, for lunchtime delivery.

IMPORTANT!

Please support our host by purchasing your food needs at the venue.

<u>PIT SAFETY:</u> Safety expectations and rules at this Meet are the same as for all FIRST events. Please refer to the FIRST manual for those standards.

GENERAL CONDUCT: Participants are expected to behave with Gracious Professionalism at all times. Unruly actions which create safety concerns may result in warnings or ejection from the site at the discretion of the organizers.

Advancement and Awards

Advancement to the Meet Championship

- Since "Winter's Edge II" is an official "NJ FTC Meet", it means that all of the Ranking Points (formerly known as QP's) ...and Tie Breaking Points (formerly known as RP's) earned by our teams on December 1st will be considered in determining teams' Ten Best Matches ...and those points will be carried into the League Tournament at season's end.
- See the New Jersey website for details on advancement to the League Tournament and on to the State Championship. Meets, such as this one, are part of the parallel path available to teams ...to reach the state championship in NJ.
- So, this is an early event but it is full of value.
